# SALUTING DADE'S COLAR-ATHLETES

haron Bloom came up with the idea, and it's working better than even she expected. Like most good ideas, it was simple: Students tutoring students. She started a year ago tutoring 10 kids at 6:30 a.m. at North Miami High. This year 25 students - mostly athletes - showed up for the extra help.

"I know how hard it is to be an athlete and to get good grades," Bloom said. "And I thought this could help.'

Bloom also knows how to juggle athletics and academics, and that's why she was chosen as one of The Herald's 10 Scholar-Athletes for 1991. Bloom was the captain of North Miami's soccer, badminton and ten-

nis teams this year and will graduate with a 4.98 grade-point average. And don't forget, she was up at 5:30 a.m. getting ready to tutor athletes such as Ochiel Swaby and Lawrence Wright, who both received scholarships to the University of Miami.

Bloom is one of five girls chosen. Carol City's Marysue James, who helped the Chiefs win the Class 4A state basketball title as a junior and was one of the best defensive centers in the state, was just as tough to beat in the classroom, where she maintained a 4.03 GPA.

Kelly Krey played volleyball, soccer and softball at Hialeah-Miami Lakes, where those teams have been among Dade's best for the past three years. She will graduate with a 4.45 GPA.

Yolanda Hobbs won three state track titles at Northwestern and she also played volleyball and basketball at a school that succeeds in both sports. She was also fast in the classroom, where she maintained a 3.99 GPA.

Lisa Sayfie led Ransom Everglades to the Class 2A state volleyball championship game her junior and senior years, and helped the Raiders win their first state title as a senior. She also averaged 17 points and 7.8 rebounds in basketball. Sayfie, one of the few volleyball players in Florida to receive a Division I scholarship, also ran on the track team as a sophomore. She will graduate with an 8.6 GPA, which translates into a 4.0, before moving on to Clemson.

Rene Abdalah is an amazing story. He

arrived in Miami four years ago without any English skills, and will graduate from Coral Gables with a 4.12 GPA. He was one of Dade's best offensive linemen, and also qualified for the Region 4-4A track meet in the discus. More important, he qualified for an academic scholarship to Brown.

South Dade's Allan Brantley is a throwback. You don't see many kids playing football and baseball anymore, but Brantley played both well, making 97 tackles as a linebacker and batting .317 with three homers and 31 RBI. If you like those numbers, try these: He will graduate fifth in his class with a 4.56 GPA.

Norland's Jacob Goldwire was one of the best defensive backs in the state and will attend Ball State on a football scholarship.

He hit the books even harder than opposing football players and has a 3.9 GPA.

Marcos Mestre was the Class 3A-2A-1A All-Dade quarterback, throwing for 1,100 vards and 11 TDs. He also pitched for the baseball team and won 10 games over two seasons. His two-year earned-run average is 1.90. His GPA is even better at 3.89.

Gulliver's Ilan Rzadkowolsky-Raoli (that's Jack-O-Wal-Ski Rau-o-Ly) is without question Dade's top swimmer. He has been an All-American all four years in high school and swam the second-fastest 200 individual medley time (1:50.4) in the nation this year. He turned down more than 50 swimming scholarship offers, including one from Stanford. Why? So he can take his 4.9 GPA off to Harvard.

# **SELECTION PROCESS**

The 10 Scholar-Athlete finalists were selected by a three-member panel of Herald judges — Paul Anger, executive sports editor; Bill Van Smith, metro sports editor; and Mike Phillips, high school sports editor. They reviewed nominations from public and private school principals in Dade County.

Nominees had to be seniors, have a minimum 3.0 grade-point average and must have won a letter in at least one sport. Further considerations were number of sports played, selection to All-Dade teams, courses taken and strength of GPA.

The top Scholar-Athletes — one boy, one girl — will be named May 29 at The Herald's All-Dade Awards Ceremonies.


