Report: Inter Miami, FC Barcelona discuss partnership to sign Messi

Another day, another Lionel Messi rumor.

The latest came Tuesday from French sports newspaper L'Equipe, which reported that FC Barcelona and Inter Miami have discussed of an arrangement in which Miami signs the Argentine superstar, then loans him to Barcelona for six to 18 months.

Inter Miami owners **Jorge and Jose Mas** and **David Beckham** were not available for comment and there are no named sources substantiating the report.

Messi's contract with Paris Saint Germain expires June 30 and among the offers he has been exploring are a return to Barca, where he spent most of his career; a \$500 million deal with Saudi Arabian club Al-Hilal; and a move to Major League Soccer to play for Inter Miami. Messi owns a vacation home in

South Florida.

The report says Messi's first choice is to return for a stint with Barcelona.

"The Catalan giant's financial situation and its heavy budgetary constraints make signing Messi extremely complicated, but the seven-time Ballon d'Or winner has given his former club time to work on it," L'Equipe reported. "The latter has already finalized substantial savings [wage cuts, end of contract for **Jordi Alba**, non-extension of **Sergio Busquets**] but they are still far from the mark and are examining B plans."

One of those alternatives is an agreement with Inter Miami.

"This would allow him to continue playing at the highest level in Europe until the Copa America 2024, to come full circle with the club of his life, before going to discover MLS," said the L'Equipe report.

The Copa America, a prestigious South American tournament, will be held in the United States in 2024 and will include six teams from CONCACAF (North and Central America and the Caribbean). It will be a test run for 2026 World Cup U.S. host cities, which include Miami.

Messi's father, **Jorge**, said last month that "The decision will never be made until after Lionel finishes the season with PSG. Once the season is over will be the time to analyze what there is and then make a decision. There are always rumors and a lot of people use Lionel's name to gain fame, but there is only one truth and we can assure that there [will be] no deal with anyone ... until after the season ends."

3 UM GAMES WON'T BE ON A SATURDAY

It's not even summer,

but college football season is closing in.

Kickoff times and broadcast information for four 2023 University of Miami football games were announced Wednesday afternoon — and three of those games are not on Saturdays.

The Hurricanes will kick off their season on Friday, Sept. 1 at 7 p.m. at Hard Rock Stadium against Miami of Ohio (ACC Network).

Fast forward to November: The Canes will end their season at noon on Friday, Nov. 24 — the day after Thanksgiving — in a nationally televised game (ABC) at Boston College.

On Saturday, Sept. 9, the Texas A&M Aggies of the Southeastern Conference will come to Hard Rock for a 3:30 p.m. game on ABC.

And on Thursday, Sept. 14, UM will face Bethune-Cookman at 7:30 p.m. (ACC Network).

The Hurricanes have

four open Saturdays — the first one the day after the home opener; the last one the day after the Boston College game. The other two open Saturdays are Sept. 16 (two days after Bethune-Cookman) and Sept. 30 (one week after the Temple road game on Sept. 23).

UM's ACC opener is at home on Oct. 7 against Georgia Tech.

Here are the opponents, in order, that the Hurricanes (5-7, 3-5 last season) will meet in 2023 and how each finished overall and in its respective conference in 2022.

The ACC's new football schedule model for 2023-26 eliminates the Coastal and Atlantic divisions and turns the league into one body of 14 teams.

The top two teams, based on conference winning percentage, will compete in the ACC Football Championship Game on Dec. 2 at Bank of America

The new model has each league member play three primary opponents annually and face the other 10 league teams twice — once at home and once on the road — during the four-year cycle.

UM's primary opponents are Florida State, Louisville and Boston College.
