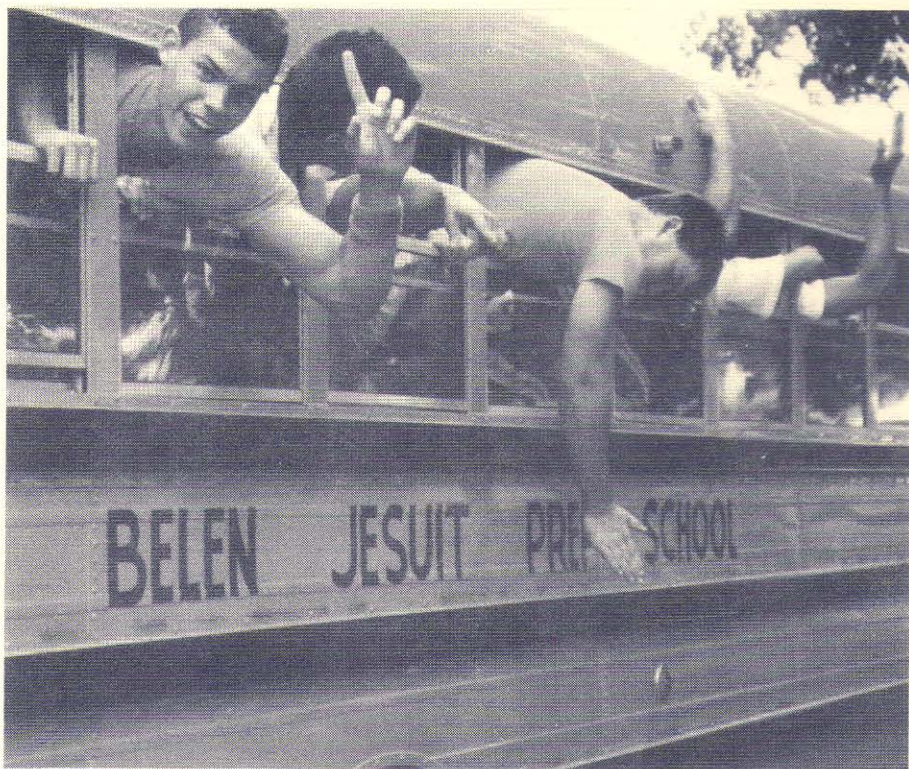

# A Message from Our Athletic Director

It will be difficult to talk about our Sports Program and not mention the success of our Football Team and the outstanding effort and work done by our players and coaches. This year's team equalled the best record for a football team in Belén's history, 8-2, and marked the first time ever that a Belén athlete leads the County in rushing yardage, in Eddy Gross, had an "All State" kicker in Luis Iglesias, and a Dade County "Coach of the Year" in Richard Stuart, as well as the first Conference Title in the Sport.

The rest of our Varsity sports did not come far behind, with the Cross Country team having another undefeated season in dual meets and having a runner making the "All County 4-A First Team" for the 4th year in a row, with Naldo González. The Varsity Swim team had another winning season and a 2nd place finish in District. The Tennis team finished with a record of 12-3 and a District runner-up trophy. The soccer team, Basketball team, Wrestling team, Baseball team, all had winning records. The Track and Field team, under the direction of Coach Dembowski, captured first place in the Conference and District, had numerous "All Conference" athletes and an "All State" runner in Naldo González.

Carlos Pérez-Abreu made it to the top 5 in the "Miami Herald Student Athletes" for Dade County.

The Basketball team was dominant in Conference games and held its own against 4-A competition. Congratulations to Coach Martínez on a job well done. The Jr. Varsity Football and Baseball teams also had winning seasons.

**At the Jr. High level:**

# Varsity Football Team

The 1987 Varsity Football Team matched its best season ever with an 8-2 record, and brought to Belén its 1st ever Gulfstream Athletic Conference Title.

The biggest reason for the great season was the strong and very unselfish leadership of the senior players. They did not care who got the credit as long as the result was in the best interest of the team.

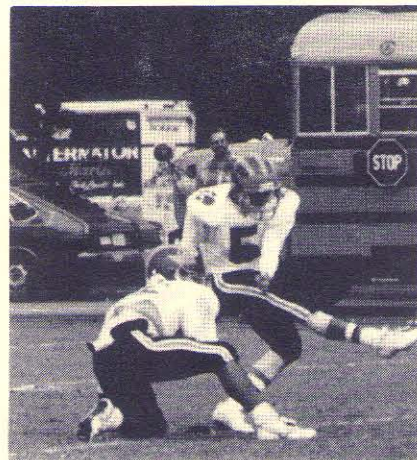
Great team attitude was not the only key to success. The experienced and cohesive offensive line, led by seniors René Sánchez, José Romano, Maurice Milton, Jorge Azcué, and juniors Mario Martínez and Manny Feijóo, blew open huge holes so that the running backs could achieve their great stats.

The team rushed for over 2,000 yards, with Dade County rushing leader Eddy Gross rushing for 1,250, Fernando Pomares for 363, and José Solórzano for 317. Quarterback Víctor López de Mendoza did an outstanding job running the offense, and receivers Artie Bohorques, Manny Mejido, Albert Alvarez and Jorge Azcué combined for over 500 yards in catches.

The defense also had a very strong year and at various times was the number-one ranked team in the County. The defense played with great intensity and rose to the occasion when they had to. Alex Tapia, John García, Juan Saizarbitoria, Mario Solórzano, Gabriel Li, and José Romano were some of the standouts on defense.

Kicker Luis Iglesias made 5 field goals, with a 47-yarder against Pace being his best effort.

After the season several players received post-season honors. José Romano, Eddy Gross, Luis Iglesias, Gabe Li,



Pablo Cejas, and René Sánchez made the All-Gulfstream Conference Team, while Gross, Romano and Iglesias all made Miami News and Herald 1st teams.

# Junior Varsity Football Team

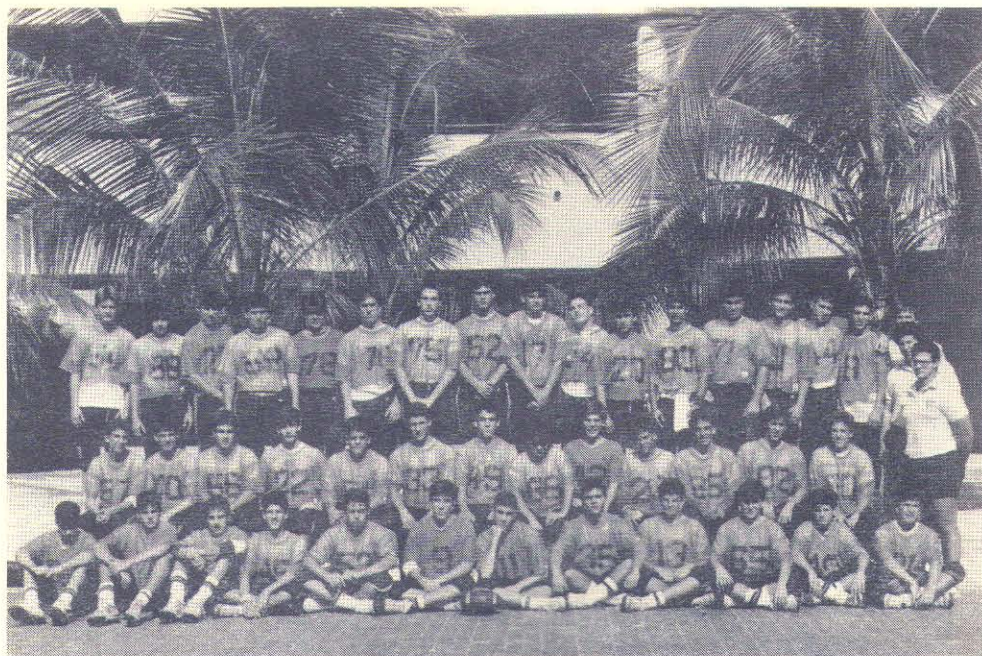

Coach Aparicio would also like to thank Coach Méndez and Coach Venegas, who did an outstanding job this year!!!

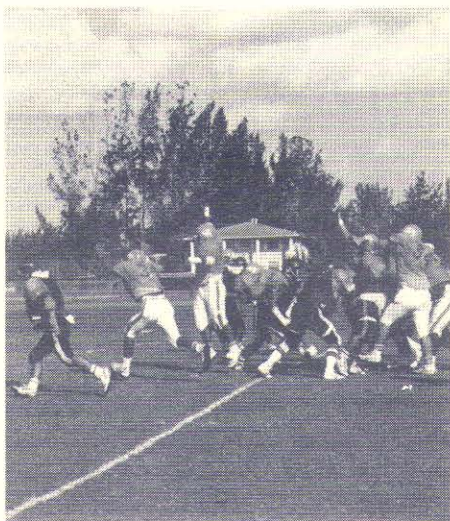

# Cross Country Team

The 1987-88 Cross Country season was filled with great expectations and ended in disappointment.

The team started out the season with a #7 ranking in the pre-season State Poll, and worked itself up to a #1 ranking with a month left to go in the season. Seniors Naldo González and Willy Braceras were providing the team with great leadership and solid performances, while junior Carlos Salvat was running well at the number 2 or 3 spot. Newcomers Juan Taboas, Javier Riera, Robert Suárez, Robert Jiménez, and Luis Suárez were just beginning to come into their own. Belén had won 3 big invitationals. The Spanish River, J.I. Leonard and the Cocoa Beach. Just when everything seemed to be going so well, "disaster struck" as quoted in *The Miami Herald*. Carlos Salvat went down with viral meningitis. Robert Suárez and Juan Taboas suffered pulled muscles. This left the team without its number 3, 4 and 5 runners. Even though they all tried to come back, they had lost out of too many valuable practices and were never able to regain their optimum physical condition.

In spite of this, the team still managed a respectable 6th place finish in the State Championship and stretched the school's winning streak for dual meets to 39. Belén has not lost a dual meet since 1984. The team record for 1987 was 9-0.

Naldo González made first team ALL COUNTY for the 2nd year in a row, and Willy Braceras, Juan Taboas, and Carlos Salvat made honorable mention.

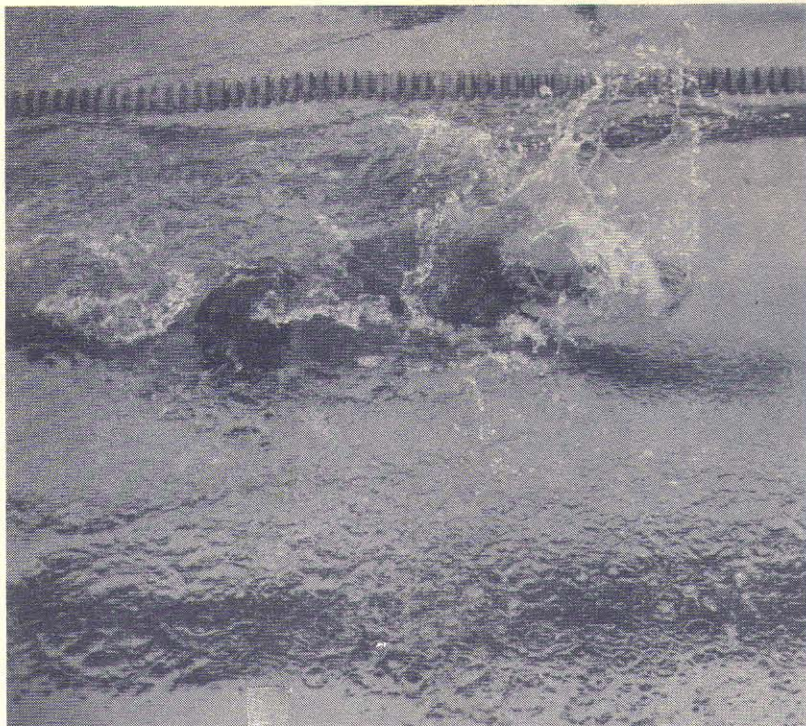

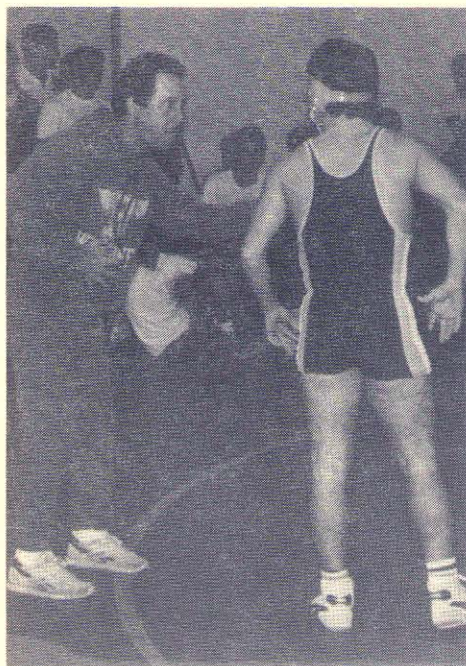
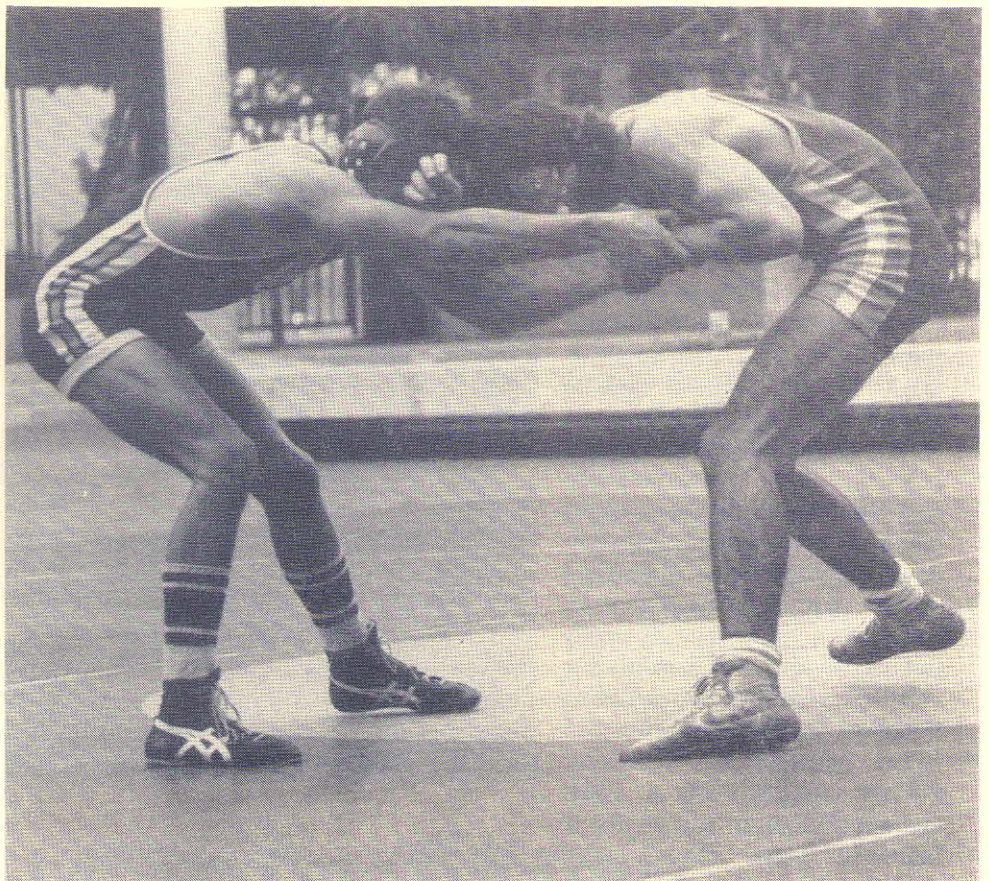
# Wrestling Team

Belén had 9 qualifying wrestlers for the regionals which were held at McArthur High School in Broward.



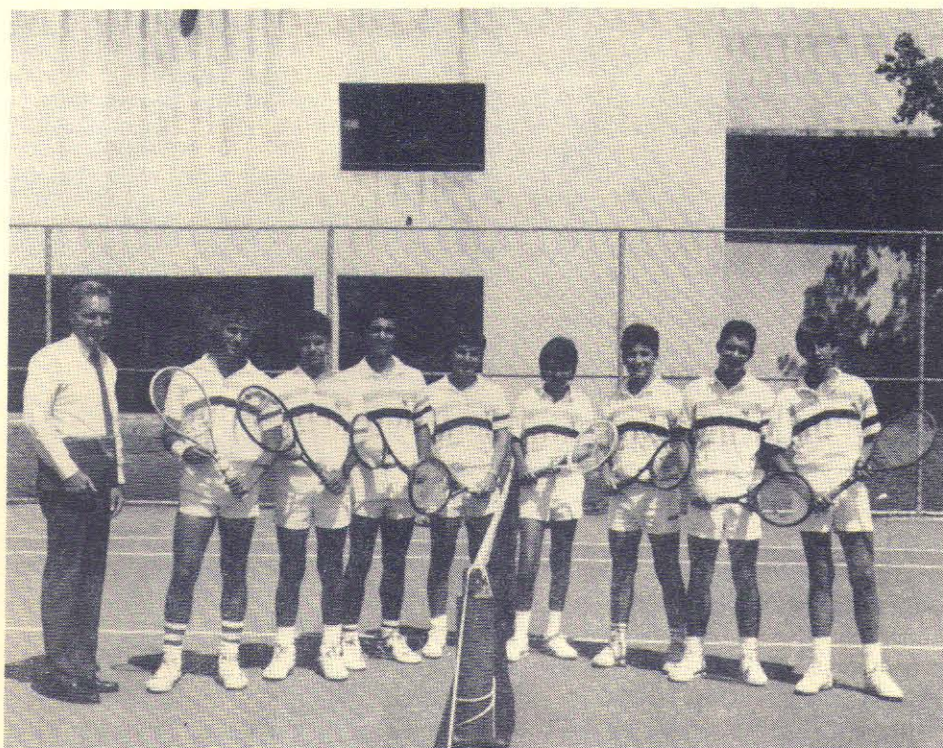

The 1988 Wolverine Track season was projected to be "a rebuilding year," but instead it was a landmark year.

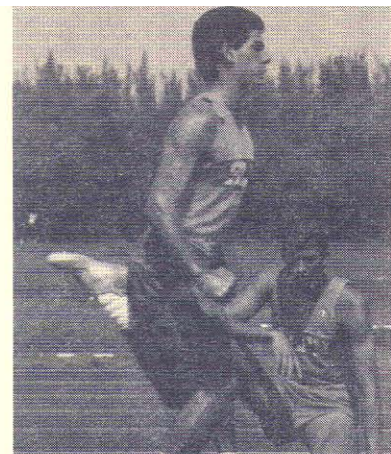
After losing the 3rd dual meet of the season, the outlook seemed bleak. However, Belén rebounded to finish the season with an incredible 10-1 record.

Finally, the track team would have never reached its potential without the tireless efforts of Coach Carlos Barquín.

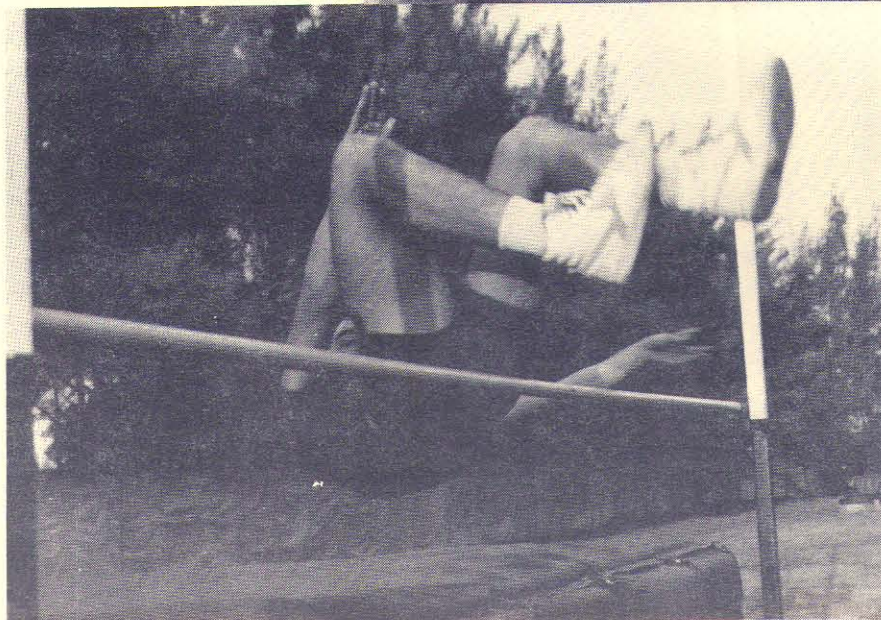
