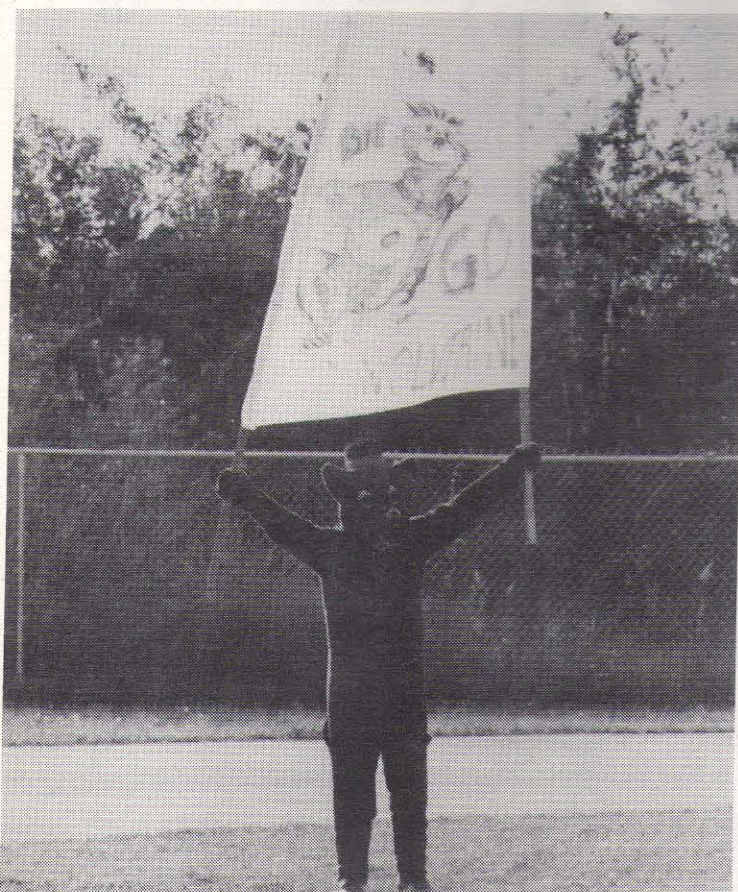

A RECAP OF 1992 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The Varsity Swim Team had another great season. The team finished Second in All of Dade County and First in the District for the 4th consecutive year! The team went on to finish 11th in the State. The **Junior High Swim Team** won its third consecutive County Championship.

The young **Varsity Cross Country Team** had another great season. The "Barq Pack" went unbeaten in dual meets 12-0, took First Place in District and County, Second in Region and 5th in State. The **Junior High Cross Country Team** was overpowering, taking First Place in all invitationals, First in Conference and First in Dade County.

The **Varsity Football Team** finished with a record of 5-5. The program has now built a tradition for being competitive each of its last 4 years. The team came out with a new offense. The **Junior Varsity Football Team** ended its season with a record of 4-2-1. New Coach Eric Hansen did an outstanding job with the young squad which had only 8th and 9th graders.

The **Varsity Soccer Team** was the surprise of the year, moving up to a tougher schedule in a rebuilding year and compiling a record of 12-3 and 4 and a District Runner-up.

The **Varsity Tennis Team** finished with a record of 11-3.

The **Junior Varsity Basketball Team** had another great season posting a record of 21 and 1. The only loss was in a double overtime to 4-A Norland.

The **Varsity Track & Field Team** completed another unbeaten season posting a 15-0 record and another District Championship. New school records were set by Ignacio García in the pole vault, Alex Muelle in the 100 and 200 meters and the 400 meter relay.

At the **Junior High** level, Belén continued its domination by winning Catholic Championships in **Cross Country, Track & Field, Baseball, Volleyball, Swimming Basketball.** County Championships were won in **Cross Country and Swimming.**

District Meet

The Varsity Soccer team, despite numerous obstacles, surpassed any expectations it had at the start of the season to finish 12-3-4 and place a very respectable second in its first year in a new district. With only four returning starters, experience was lacking. Furthermore, Head Coach Osborne could not join the team until just before its first game. Finally, due to last season's success, this year's team faced a difficult schedule, featuring opponents such as La Salle, Homestead, Ransom, Key West, and Coral Park. The Wolverines managed to overcome these difficulties thanks in large part to the play of its seven regulars, who started every game: forward and leading scorer, Víctor Sállick (co-captain); mid-fielders Ernie Morán (co-captain), Gaby Morán, and Danny Súniga; defenders Fernie Font and Javier Placer; and goalkeeper Eddie Mena, who posted eight shut-outs.

After winning nine of their last eleven games, the team headed into the District play-offs, which were held at Belén. The Wolverines defeated Pace, 4-0, to reach the final for the second year in a row, but lost to Key West for the third time this season, 1-0. When asked how the team was able to go far beyond expectations, Coach Osborne replied, "Víctor, Ernie, and Eddie were definitely the backbone of the team, but the key to our success was the team's execution of 'total soccer,' to which everyone contributed."

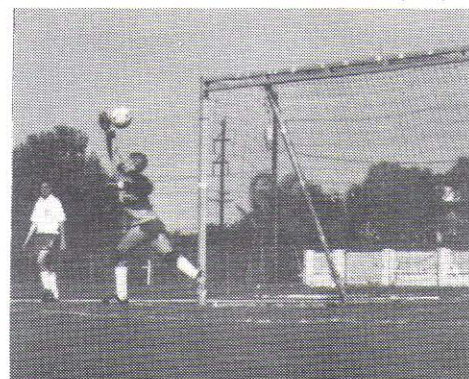
Junior Varsity Team. This introduction alone symbolizes this team's sense of accomplishment and success. They played together as a team for the first time against some very difficult opponents.

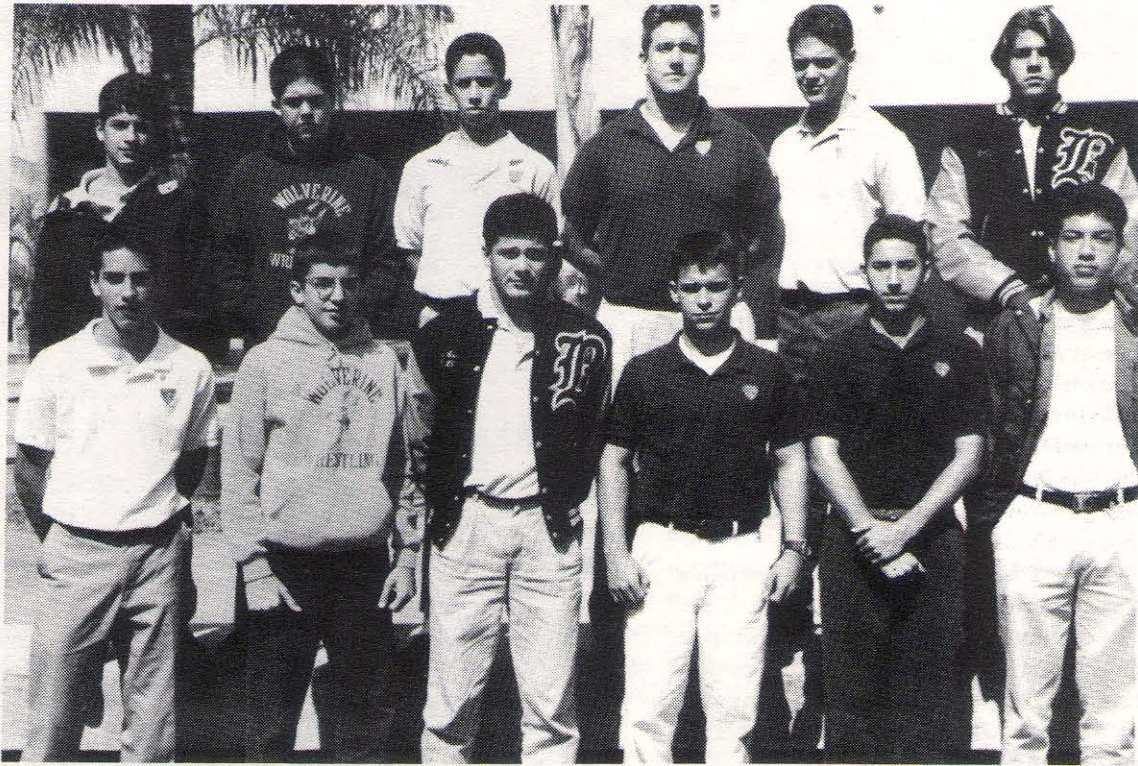

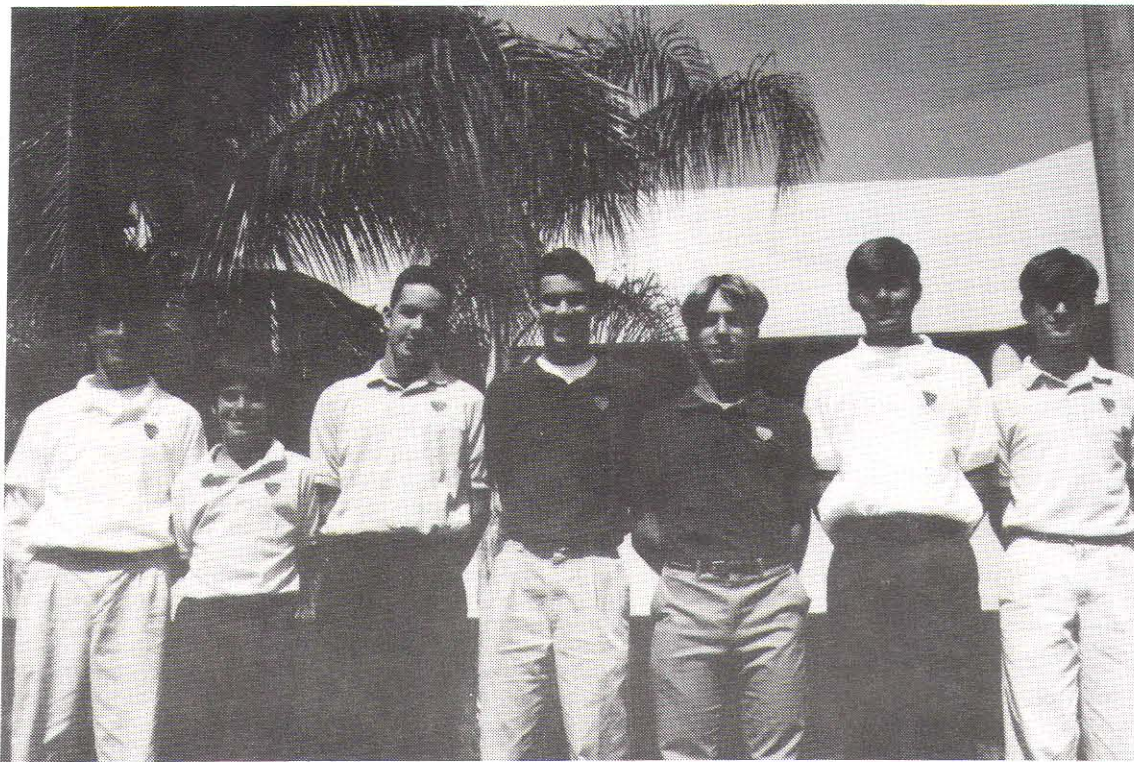
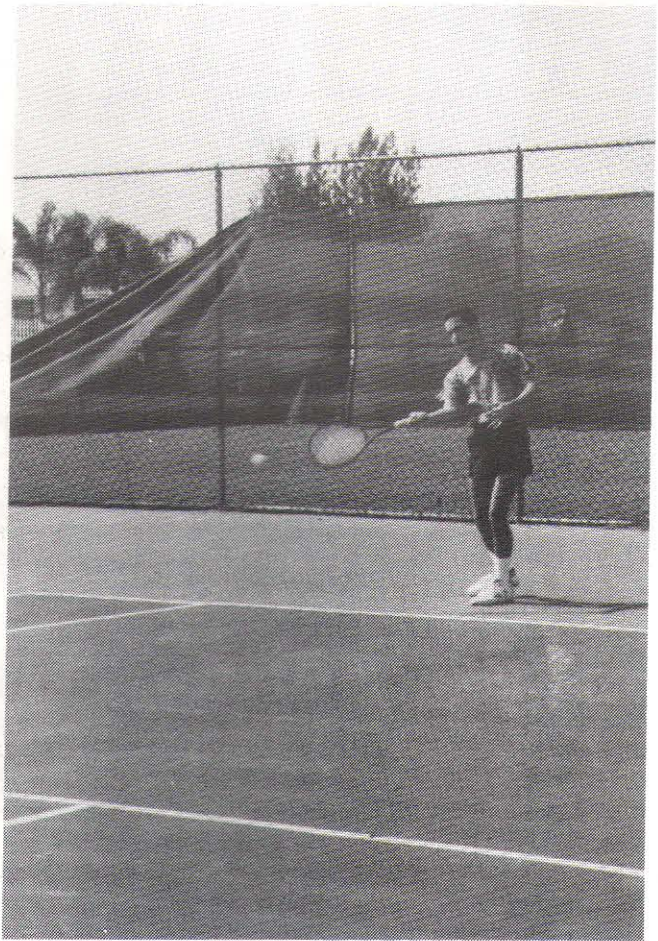

The 1992 season could have been labeled the rebuilding year, with 17 lettermen graduating from the previous year, it was in reality, quite an experience.

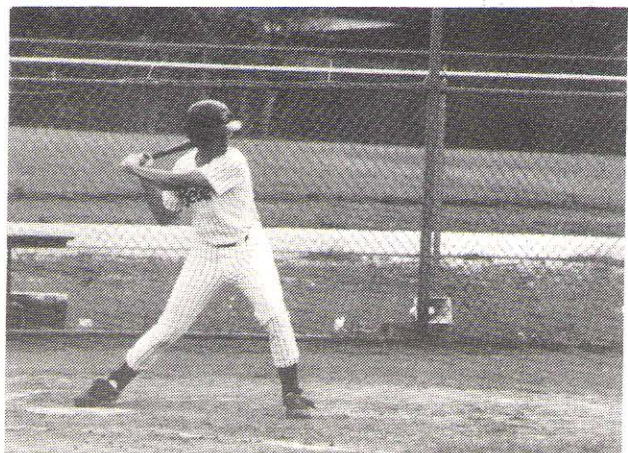

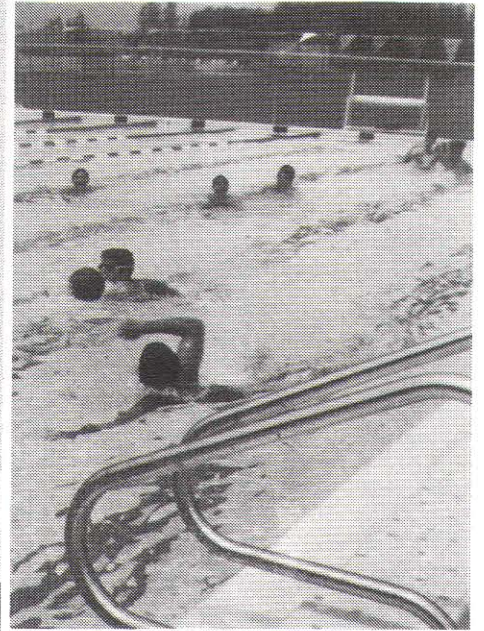
The team played with great poise and won most of its matches in straight sets. The only close game was a 3-game set to Blessed Trinity for the
