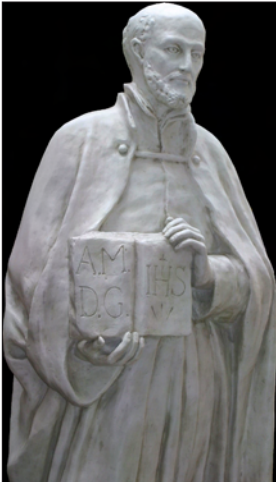

A MESSAGE FROM THE ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

3 STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS!!!!
BASEBALL TEAM IN THE FINAL 4!!!!

What a year!!!! It started out with the varsity swim team winning their FIRST EVER STATE CHAMPIONSHIP, in an exciting state finals held at the Ft. Lauderdale Hall of Fame Pool. Leading their team to victory were State Champions and event winners Carlos Araque, Patrick Arenson, Sebastian Orozco, Pablo Morejon, Andrés Simauchi and Raymond Zomerfeld, the team captain. The following week the varsity cross country team came back with the school's second ever State Championships in the sport; under the inspiration of Guillermo Echarte's crawl to the finish and the spirited performances by Connor McCarthy, Javier Zamparelli, Michael Cruz, and Jason Oliver their combined team effort led Belen to the second State Title in the span of one week. It didn't stop there. Here comes the Spring Season and something miraculous happened! Belen Jesuit wins their first state championship in the sport of Track and Field behind outstanding performances from individual State Champions Andrew Jacobs who went undefeated in the 300 intermediate hurdles, the 4 X 800 relay composed of Jason Oliver, Javier Zamparelli, Daniel Silva and Robert Arán. At the time, the quartet recorded the fastest time in the entire State and the 5th. best time in the Nation. Other outstanding performances came from Guillermo Echarte, Alex Del Rio and Larry Durán.



VARSIITY BASEBALL:

The varsity baseball team has won the Regional Championship and has qualified to the state final 4. The team captured first place in district and won the region quarter final and semi final games with dramatic come from behind victories. They hit dramatic winning home runs while trailing in the last inning. The first one came from catcher Byron Soler who had a 3 and 2 count with two outs and a runner on base and the second one came from outfielder Eric Cos who had a count of 0 and 1 with one out and a runner on first.

WATER POLO:

The young water polo team came away with a district championship in a very exiting overtime win against Ransom Everglades. And then lost a heartbreaker to Gulliver Prep by the same margin of one goal in a sudden death overtime period that kept them out of the State final 4. Three of the starters were picked to the Miami Herald All County first team.

CREW:

The varsity crew also came away with their best season ever, finishing second in the over all point standings at the State Championships regatta in a field of well over 20 schools. The varsity 8 finished just behind State Champions and traditional power house Winter Park. In the regatta the freshman 8 was the fastest boat in their category. At South Florida Championships hosted by Belen Jesuit, the team came away with 6 gold medals, 1 silver and 1 bronze and captured first place over all in the team championships.

WRESTLING:

The varsity wrestling team finished with a 15 and 5 record and took first place in the District Championships. Ricardo Rodríguez, Dylan Rico and Steven Rico qualified to the State Championship tournament.

VARSIITY BASKETBALL GOLF AND FOOTBALL:

All three teams finished as district runner ups in their respective sports. The varsity basketball team finished with a record of 19 and 8, the golf team finished with a record of 7 and 4 and the varsity football team finished with a record of 9 and 2. All three teams reached that State Play offs. Andrew Fernández, Gus Duquesne, Frank Estévez and Greg Fontela were chosen to the Miami Herald All County First team.

VARSIITY TENNIS:

The varsity tennis team finished with a record 9 and 5 and Roland Martínez was one of 5 players to be picked as first team "All County". Roland made it all the way to the State Semifinals before loosing to the number 1 ranked player in the State.

VARSIITY SOCCER ROLLER HOCKEY AND VOLLEYBALL:

The soccer team ended with a record of 8 wins 5 loses and 2 ties and lost an overtime game against Monsignor Pace in the district play-offs. The volleyball team ended with a record of 4 and 8 and the roller hockey team ended with a fine record of 12 and 3 .

Belen Jesuit athletic program continues to rank among the top 4 schools in the entire state for their over all athletic program (Male division).

Greg Fontela continues the tradition of outstanding Student athletes by making the Miami Herald top 5 list of student athlete. Belen Jesuit has accomplished this more often than any other school in the County.

JUNIOR VARSITY AND FRESHMEN SPORTS:

The junior varsity/ frehsmen sports ended with a combined record of 87 wins and 20 losses. The Roller hockey team finished unbeaten and the freshman 8 crew team finished number 1 in the State.

MIDDLE SCHOOL:

Belen Jesuit continues their dominance in the middle school division. Belen has the best sports program of any school at that level as evident with them winning County and State Championships in the sports of cross country and track and field. Four teams had unbeaten seasons, basketball, soccer, cross country and track and field. Their combined record was 72 wins and only 10 losses.

NEW PROJECTS:

The Belen Jesuit Athletic Department is looking to relocate the tennis courts, build a new Olympic size 50 meter pool, football locker room, larger weight room and wrestling room. Improvements were made to the physical education and varsity locker rooms, new lockers were installed and the new basketball locker rooms were completed.

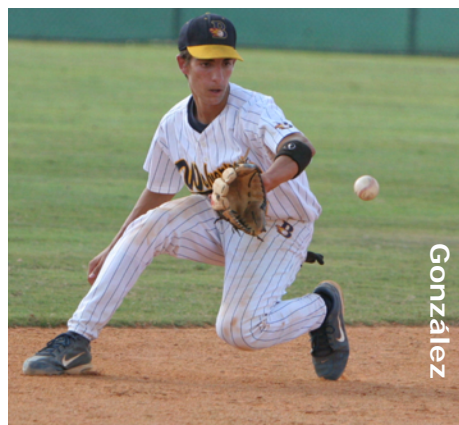

Lead by Guillermo Echarte's dramatic crawl to the finish line, the 5 scoring teammates (Conor McCarthy, Javier Zamparelli, Michael Cruz, Jason Oliver) left its own deep and bright gold mark in Belen's history. Belen gives Belen the team title

The Belen boys captured the state championship, giving Miami-Dade its first swimming title in 34 years.

It was a celebration worthy of a 34-year wait. Once Belen Jesuit had realized the state title was theirs, the team piled on coach Kirk Peppas before breaking out into song.

When the announcement was made and the medals handed out, a fully clothed Peppas was tossed in the pool and was quickly followed by his swimmers.

If ever the Wolverines had a reason to go overboard with excitement, Thursday was it. Belen Jesuit ended the three-decade state title drought in Miami-Dade in swimming, winning the FHSAA Class 2A boys' swimming title at the Fort Lauderdale Aquatic Complex.

"That was a long time coming," Peppas said. "It's a wonderful feeling. You plan for it, you get disappointed when you don't get it and then it finally happens."

Belen, who beat second-place Satellite by 66.5 points, is the first team from Dade to win a state title since the Miami Springs girls won in 1972. The Wolverines, who failed in their bid for the crown a year ago, were anchored by a strong effort

from the relays, who won all three events.

Carlos Araque was the only individual winner for Belen as he took the 100 breaststroke by the closest margin of the evening, beating out Donald Gerlach from St. Augustine Menendez by .07 seconds.

"The first 50 I noticed that he was right next to me, so I knew I wanted him to go as fast as he would get tired," Araque said. "Somehow I knew that I had a little more endurance. The last 25 I was just thinking 'if you want it this bad and you've come this far, just get it and I did.'"

Araque edged Gerlach by .02 seconds during the final 50 yards.

The Wolverines started the day off strong during the prelims, advancing seven individual swimmers and grabbing the top seed in all three relays. In the finals, they kept rolling as the 200 medley relay team cruised to a four-second win.

In the final event of the night, Belen edged Leon by 27 seconds in the 400 free relay. In the race, Raymond Zomerfeld swam a 49.50 during the third leg to help give the Wolverines some breathing room.

"We worked for it. Everybody gave it our all," said Zomerfeld, who is the Wolverines captain. "It really shows that swimming isn't an individual sport. It's a team effort and you can't just go out for

yourself. You have to give it for your brothers."

Zomerfeld also finished fourth in the 200 IM.

While Araque grabbed the only individual win for the Wolverines, the 100 butterfly gave Belen its best showing in a non-relay as Cantera Lopez finished fourth, and Orozco finished sixth to give Belen 28 points in the race.

Pablo Morejón earned a 100-yard piece finish in the 50 free.

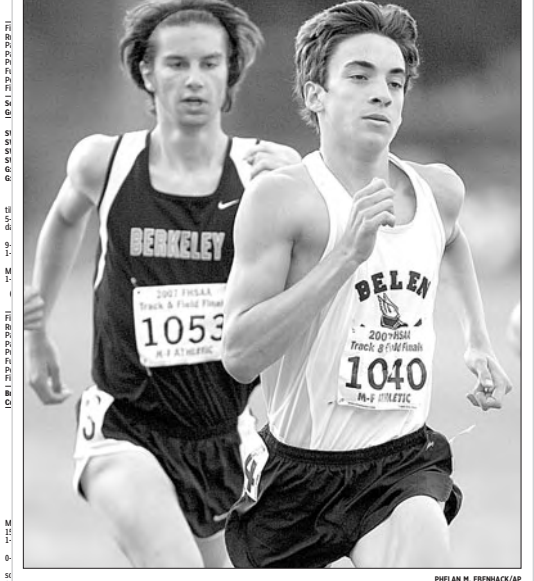
